However, with age comes the need for renewal. Installed in 2002, the zipline's structure shows 22 years of service. During a recent inspection, our technician noted critical areas requiring attention to keep this experience safe and accessible. Without significant renovations, we cannot operate the zipline for the 2025 camping season. The cost of repairs and modifications is estimated at \$75,000. This includes replacing the staircase leading to the top deck, renovating the platform where countless campers have been "strong and courageous," and making other necessary updates. These repairs will preserve the zipline and expand its accessibility, enabling younger riders to join in the adventure for years to come.

Over the past three years, our "Refresh, Renew, Restore" capital campaign has focused on updating Camp Allendale's facilities to better serve our mission. Thanks to the generous support of 194 families and individuals,
