







2022-2023 Financial Report 2024 Projections

We closed the 2023 Fiscal year with an operating fund balance of \$119,286. Church and individual gifts to the general fund were below projected amounts. Camp registration income increased 5% which was less than anticipated. Retreat income exceeded projections by \$90,000. Another record setting year for non-summer months activity!

Designated gifts to the Renew, Refresh, Restore Initiative, Camper Scholarships, Resident Missionary, Debt Reduction and Needs Lists was \$174,675. That income is not reflected in the figures to the left. Designated gifts are not used to fund General Operating Expenditures.

* Miscellaneous income includes transferring \$100,000 from the reserve fund to cover additional salary expenses during the executive director transition.

The current camp debt balance is \$405,968. A reduction of \$64,879 since October of 2022. A more detailed financial report as well as the camp's most recent IRS Form 990 is available by request to the Camp Office.

We closed the 2023 Fiscal year with an operating fund balance of \$119,286. Church and individual gifts to the general fund were below projected amounts. Camp registration income increased 5% which was less than anticipated. Retreat income exceeded projections by \$90,000. Another record setting year for non-summer months activity!




