I have struggled for weeks on writing my last article. I have chosen to focus on my greatest accomplishments during my time as Camp Allendale's Executive Director. In 2005 when I arrived here, I brought with me my wife Nancy. For our 37 years in Christian Camping, she has been right beside me, always willing to take on any role that was necessary to make our ministry successful. She has been the one to take my scribbles and ideas and turn them into properly formatted appeal letters, newsletters, and flyers. Her love for plants and trees is evident throughout the camp landscape.

When I became the director, I "inherited" Steve Burkett and Mike Proctor. Their expectations of excellence and quality in our facilities have been second to none. Parents, campers, and retreat guests have always commented on the cleanliness and quality of our facility and grounds. Steve was on staff until 2018; he now regularly volunteers. Mike is completing his 22nd year as our Facility Manager.

I hired Linda Rice as our Food Service Manager in 2010. Linda oversees a staff of 20 in the summer, preparing over 1500 meals a day. Our Retreat guests consistently give high marks throughout the Fall and Spring months for the meals her team prepares.

In 2011 I recruited Sam Willard to serve as our Guest Services Director. Sam played a critical role in helping the camp navigate the school balanced calendar challenge when we lost two full weeks of summer programming. He was instrumental in expanding our off-season retreat ministry to what is now over 175 events annually. We survived the crazy Covid years of 2020 and 2021 together!

Paul Burton served as a Summer Staff team member in 2006 and 2007. We quickly recognized his multiple talents

and commitment to serving God with his abilities. With a little coxing from Mike and Steve, Paul was hired as our Facility Coordinator in 2013. His past experience as a cabinet maker, car enthusiast, and all-around handyman has blessed the camp beyond measure.

Coreliss Graves approached me with her resume long before I knew we needed her skills. A few months later, we made some shifts in staff roles, and she was the perfect person to fill the newly created bookkeeper position. Her greatest passion is assisting children of incarcerated parents with getting camp scholarships through Prison Fellowship.

In 2022, Marley Butler came on board as our Guest Service Director. Marley has brought our retreat ministry to even greater heights. She has a true customer service heart which is evident in her dealing with our Program Directors and retreat guests.

It has been my honor and privilege to lead this awesome team. They have made my job easy, many times stretching me more than I have them. With Max in the driver's seat, Allendale's future impact on people's lives for Christ will definitely exceed what one can imagine.
